| | Job Steps | Potential Hazards | Risk Rating (Before Controls) | Hazard Controls | Risk Rating (After Controls) | | | | |
| 1 | Access Area | Slips, Trips, and Falls: uneven surface, slippery surface. Congested work area: Other equipment, materials or workers in area. | C2 | Hazard assessment of area prior to start of task. Wear all site and JHA specific PPE at all times. Watch footing on uneven / slippery surfaces. Wear appropriate footwear for task. Flag off work area. Remove materials or store properly. Communicate with others. | D4 | | | | |
| 2 | Gather / Inspect/ Fuel equipment for Task. | MSI: Improper lifting or moving of equipment. Pinch Points: Caught between equipment sections. Malfunctioning equipment: ruptured hose, loose fittings, damaged equipment, and fuel spillage. | C4 | Use proper lifting techniques, get help / give help, Maximum 45lbs lifting. Watch hand and body placement. Wear all appropriate PPE for task. Lock out equipment before inspection. Tag out any defective equipment and remove from service. Use spill tray for fueling of equipment. Fire extinguisher on hand. Let equipment cool down before refueling. | D4 | | | | |
| 3 | Power up and use of equipment. | MSI: Repetitive task, strains or sprains from twisting turning of power washer wand. Eye / body injuries: flying debris, mud. Burns: Hand or body burned by hot motor/exhaust. Body / hand injury: Due to contact with high pressure water. Hand / Body Injuries: Due to contact with unattended pressure washer hose and wand. Hearing Damage: Due to loud noise from pressure washer. | В3 | Stretch / flex before and during task. Take micro breaks as needed. Change up task as needed. Always have good grasp/hold of pressure washer wand. Wear all appropriate site-specific PPE including face shield, rubber gloves. Be aware of surroundings; keep hands and body away from hot areas. Do not place body or hands in line of fire of high-pressured water. Turn off equipment when not in use. Wear appropriate hearing protection for task. | C 5 | | | | |
| 4 | Fueling | MSI: Strains and sprains from improper lifting or moving of equipment. Slips, Trips and Falls: uneven surface, slippery surface. Pinch Points: Caught between equipment sections. Fire: Due to storing equipment while still hot. | C3 | Use proper lifting techniques, get help / give help, maximum 45lbs lifting. Watch hand and body placement. Wear all appropriate PPE for task. Watch footing on uneven / slippery surfaces. Store equipment in appropriate area; allow equipment to cool down before placing in storage. | C5 | | | | |
