

Safe Work Practice RIGGING OPERATION

Potential Hazards (Risk Priority MEDIUM)

- Overloading of rigging
- Weight of load
- Pinch points
- Failure of safety latches
- Worn/kinks in cabling
- All personnel must ensure they have been appropriately trained by their supervisor.

Required Personal Protective Equipment and Devices

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Safe Work Practice

- Do Not Operate the machinery unless you have been properly trained
- Ensure that you are wearing ALL PPE as noted above
- Do Not overload
- Review the inspection logs prior to use and conduct a pre-operation form
- **Do Not** operated if there are any defects
- Check the load nearing capacity of the rigging prior to use
- Check the expiration date of the rigging prior to use (will be located on the rigging)
- Proper use of tag lines
- **Do Not** operate unless you have been trained/certified to do so

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If an emergency situation occurs while conducting this task, or there is an equipment malfunction, shut the equipment off immediately and follow the lock out procedure.

REPORT ANY HAZARDOUS SITUATION TO YOUR SUPERVISOR IMMEDIATELY

This must be reviewed any time the task, equipment, or materials change and at minimum, every three years.
