

Safe Work Practice WORKING ALONE

Potential Hazards (Risk Priority HIGH)

- Inadequate provision of first aid
- Sudden illness
- Physical violence from intruders
- Limited ability to call for help
- All personnel must ensure they have been appropriately trained by their supervisor.

Safe Work Practice

- When possible; avoid working alone
- Check in with another worker every 20 minutes by means of phone or messaging
- Review the company program for working alone
- Conduct a hazard assessment to include working alone
- **Do Not** allow unknown visitors on the premises
- Contact the worker who is working alone if you haven't heard from them in 20 minutes
